





A direct and logical consequence of the New England primer and of the passion for it displayed by such as Buckingham was the Boston Athenaeum, whose beginnings go back to 1805. "Our engraving shows the interior of the library, a beautiful apartment. The style of architecture and decoration is Italian, and exhibits great elegance of finish. The windows on the left of picture open on the Granary Burying-ground, and are so lofty that they overlook the trees of the cemetery. This apartment contains about 40,000 volumes."

Below is another bookish room, the store of John P. Jewett & Company, the Boston firm that published *Uncle Tom's Cabin*. Everyone knows that Lincoln, meeting Mrs. Stowe, said: "So this is the little lady that made the great war"; not so many people know that Phillips & Sampson (whose office we saw on an earlier page) had declined the book, saying it would not sell a thousand copies.

Among Boston manufactures for 1837, printed books ranked first in capital invested, second only to clothing in hands employed and third in value.




